NEW CELL PHONE POLICY

As many in the State are aware, Governor DeWine signed into law a bill (House Bill 250), which requires school districts to limit cell phone use and reduce cell phone-related distractions in classrooms. At Crestline Exempted Village Schools, we are dedicated to ensuring that students have the best learning environment possible. Research shows that personal communication devices (PCDs) like phones and tablets can distract students and negatively impact their performance and mental health. As a result, we have updated our policy to limit the use of PCDs during school hours.

Students are allowed to use PCDs before and after school, during after-school activities, and while on school buses. However, during school hours, PCDs must be turned off and stored out of sight unless approved by a teacher or administrator. This helps maintain focus on learning and reduces distractions in the classroom. Each classroom will have a locker, which can be locked to secure the devices, while they are in the classroom. At the end of the class students will retrieve their device.

Using PCDs to record or transmit audio, video, or images without consent is strictly prohibited and considered an invasion of privacy. Students must also avoid using PCDs to access inappropriate content or engage in bullying. Violations of these rules will result in disciplinary action, including confiscation of the device and possible involvement of law enforcement.

We encourage students and parents to understand the importance of this policy in creating a positive and productive school environment. While PCDs can be useful tools, their misuse can hinder educational success. Let's work together to ensure that Crestline Exempted Village Schools remain a place where every student can thrive academically and personally.

Child Find is the requirement under federal law that public schools must look for, find, and evaluate children who need special education. It applies to all children, including those who are homeschooled or in private schools, plus kids who are migrants or without homes.

Crestline Exempted Village Schools is committed to the location, identification, and provision of a free and appropriate public education (FAPE) for all children between the ages of three and 21 who have a disability and reside within our school district.

OHIO CONTENT LEARNING STANDARDS

Crestline EVSD wants to partner with parents and families to help every student in the District be successful. It is very important for parents to know what the Ohio Content Learning Standards are for each grade because these standards outline the specific knowledge and skills students are expected to learn at each grade level. Understanding these standards helps parents support their child's learning at home, track academic progress, and effectively communicate with teachers about their child's strengths and areas for improvement. This awareness ensures that parents can actively participate in their child's education and collaborate with educators to promote academic success. Below is a brief outline of what students will learn at each grade level, preschool through Grade 8.

PΚ

The Ohio Content Learning Standards for preschool are designed to provide young children with a strong foundation for future learning. These standards cover essential areas like language development, early literacy, and numeracy skills. In language and literacy, preschoolers learn to recognize letters, sounds, and simple words, fostering a love for reading. Quarters to Trimesters

We wanted to inform you about an important change we are implementing at Crestline Elementary School starting this upcoming academic year. Beginning in the 2024-2025 school year, we will be transitioning from a quarterly academic calendar to a trimester system.

What does this mean for your child?

Extended Learning Periods: Instead of four shorter terms, your child will now have three longer terms per academic year. This adjustment allows for more in-depth exploration of subjects and concepts.

Revised Curriculum: Our educators have carefully revised the curriculum to align with the trimester format, ensuring comprehensive coverage of all necessary learning objectives.

Focused Assessment and Feedback: With longer terms, teachers will have more time to assess student progress and provide meaningful feedback that supports your child's academic growth.

Stability and Consistency: The trimester system provides a more consistent and stable schedule for students, which can enhance their overall learning experience.

Grade Card Changes

The Crestline Exempted Village School District is committed to fulfilling our district mission of achieving excellence through education. At the elementary level, part of fulfilling this mission includes using standards-based report cards to provide students and parents specific, timely and actionable feedback.

What is a standards-based report card?

A standards-based report card is designed to provide accurate information about student performance in meeting the standard. In other words, rather than focusing on a percentage or number of points obtained, standards-based reporting focuses on student understanding or competency. With standards-based reporting, the conversation shifts from "What is my child's score?" to "What is my child able to do?" While student work habits are important skills, these skills are reported separately. Marks for the standard are intended to reflect student performance in meeting the standard.

Why do we use performance levels for the standards instead of letter grades?

The learning progressions of children are too complex to be reduced to a simple letter grade. Our standards-based reporting system is designed to provide specific and timely information about the specific skills students are progressing towards mastering.

Score	Standard Based Indicators	
3 or M	Mastery	Student consistently and independently demonstrates mastery of the standard.
2 or P	Progressing Toward Mastery	Student is progressing toward consistent and independent mastery of the standard.
1 or N	Intervention Required	Student requires intervention to demonstrate progress toward the standard.


